Step 3: Pay the Change Fee

- \$75–\$150 per passenger (depends on sailing date).

Step 4: Submit Documents

Email scans to guestservices@royalcaribbean.com or fax as instructed.

Timing is Critical!

 **Complete name changes at least 60 days before sailing. Last-minute changes are rarely permitted.**

 **Note: If the new passenger is under 21+1(866)-228-3050 a parental consent form is also required.**

6. How to Handle Unwanted Itinerary Changes (Labadee/Haiti/Alaska)
